Betty has been chairman on more than one occasion especially when there has been an interregnum waiting for a new Chairman to take office. Betty has also acted as Vice-Chairman permanently.

John has also been an active member of the Association looking after the Community Hall for bookings, invoicing, collecting payment and banking the same. Maintenance of the Hall has also been Betty and John's lot, causing many 'headaches' for them at all hours of the day, putting in repairs where required.

Apart from the Association they are both connected in many other activities. In the early years they were Front-of-House Managers when the present Theatre Group was known as the 'Let's do a Play Club'. Catering often came with the task as well.

That's not all! Betty was very involved with the Afternoon W.I. and has been President on two occasions, the local organiser for 'Meals on Wheels' and with Hagley Helpline. John was also concerned with Helpline when it started up and he is a longstanding member of Men's Hagley Probus Club. Betty is a member of the Lady's Hagley Probus Club which was formed more recently.

John is a gifted artist and an Associate of the Royal College of Art, London. His interest in art led him to become a member of the Hagley Art Club exhibiting his pictures at the Club's Annual Exhibition each year. One can easily understand this artistic ability as he was, before retirement, chief designer for cut and engraved glass designs with Stuart Crystal. In fact one of his patterns is now being produced and on sale as the 'Luxton Collection'. The design in question was considered too modern at the time of its conception but it is now very much in keeping with design trends of today. John retired from Stuart's in 1985.

They have both been good servants to the community of Hagley and the village and being octogenarians they now desrve to have a rest with more time to themselves.



FROM ANOTHER TME.... THE HAGLEY MAGAZINE 1862-64

It is often surprising what has survived from the past. Tucked away in Birmingham Central Library is a magazine which offers an interesting look at life in mid-Victorian Hagley. produced from 1862 until 1864 by the Revd. William Henry Lyttleton, the *Hagley Magazine* filled its pages with all sorts of local information - inspection reports on the school, the efforts to erect a church tower, servants seeking places, church notices and, of course, events at the Hall. The magazine cost 2d and appeared each month, but did not break even let alone make a profit. With sales of 225 copies of each issue (more than half of them outside the village), Lyttleton was forced to subsidise publication; in 1864, faced with paying another £20 to cover costs, he abandoned the venture.

This is very much a view of Victorian Hagley through the eyes of its vicar. Lyttleton proudly included the impressive inspection reports of the National School (where the pupils tended gardens as well as learned arithmetic) and accounts of enjoyable public dinners at the Arms, but did not conceal his disappointment at some small congregations at his church. On one occasion only one person turned up to hear his sermon! Billy Lyttleton remained vicar of Hagley until his death in 1884. He is buried in the churchyard at St. John's
