

HAGLEY MEDICAL PRACTICE PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP

In 2001 the NHS published *The Expert Patient: A New Approach to Chronic Disease Management for the 21st Century.* The aim of this initiative was to introduce selfmanagement training programmes for patients with long term chronic illness, heart disease, diabetes, arthritis etc, to improve their quality of life. The pilot phase is now ending and has been a notable success, with an estimated 20,000 patients having been trained across England. The project will now be rolled out across the whole NHS with a targeted completion by 2007.

Wyre Forest PCT is running training courses in Bewdley, Kidderminster and Strourport over the next few months. Anyone interested should contact reception at the Surgery for more information or mention it to your doctor at your next regular appointment.

There has been an increase in traffic warden patrols in the village and parking tickets will be issued. You have been warned.

I have also been asked to remind the shops and businesses in Worcester Road not to pile up their rubbish in the driveway adjacent to Three Cooks. This is private land and should not be used as a dumping ground at any time.

As we moved out of Stourbridge Crematorium chapel the organist played Roses of Picardy, and this would have appealed to her sense of humour.



POLICING IN HAGLEY

I know that a lot of residents like to read the articles I place in the Village News.

Unfortunately due to circumstances beyond my control I've been unable to submit my reports over the last few months, but I hope to get back to them now.

In the early part of the year, as you will know, there was a rising amount of damage and anti-social behaviour taking place on and around the playing fields. We carried out an operation resulting in a number of young people being arrested and given conditions to stay out of Hagley until their cases were heard. We can report that it was a quieter summer than usual without the large groups of young people gathering in that area.

Another factor has been the introduction of the alcohol ban instigated by the Parish Council and supported by the Police. We have also been working together with the District Council bidding for funds to extend the CCTV coverage onto the playing fields. We had a meeting with Government Officers in October and hope to hear soon if we have been successful.

Residents in the area of Summervale Road, Milestone and Cavendish Drives have been affected by the construction traffic travelling to the new housing development. We have been visiting the area, monitoring traffic movements to deter speeding and parking problems. I am also aware of parking problems in the village and have asked the Traffic Warden to visit on occasions to check the situation.

HAGLEY WIVES' AND WOMEN'S FELLOWSHIP



HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY

On Tuesday September 7th the members were entertained with an informative and amusing talk given by Mr M. Mills entitled "My Grandmother was a Gypsy". Mr Mills first described the social structure of the Romany Society. It is a male dominated one in which women have

to obey men absolutely, and with the roles of the sexes clearly defined. Women, for instance, are not allowed to touch the horses. Boys, from an early age, are taught to poach so that they can catch rabbits, squirrels, badgers and hedgehogs etc, all of which provide meat acceptable to the gypsy. Gypsies have various forms of marriage, some include Christian procedures, but all are recognised as binding by the tribe. As for Mr Mill's grandmother; she was a remarkable character, known as "Big Louie", she weighed 18 stone but was only 4ft 10ins tall. She bore 18 children and despite smoking a pipe for most of her life and a liking for alcohol she lived to be 96. Her natural remedy treatments for minor ailments were sought by many, but often sounded worse than the disease, with evil tasting or smelling concotions being administered. Mr Mills finished by answering questions from the audience.


