





Heartstart

Heartstart is a branch of The British Heart Foundation set up to give information to the general public. We are a group of volunteers called Bromsgrove and District Heartstart who visit clubs and societies to demonstrate basic resuscitation techniques.

During the last year we trained 300 people who will now have the skills to save a life. We meet once a month for our own training and then go out to do extra demonstrations. 


