HAGLEY COMMUNITY CENTRE

As the start of the new financial year, this month we have produced a short report on the recent events within the Community Association.

The new Committee is working well; all the new members undertook their various duties with enthusiasm, which is continuing so far! The changeover of the bookings system went smoothly and it is now well established.

Advertising continues well, with several new enquiries each month. Usually at this time, we lose some advertisers, far various reasons, but the revenue is still covering the costs of the Village News. We would be pleased to receive comments on the black and white format.

The revised Terms & Conditions for booking the Community Centre are printed on the back cover this month, and are accompanied by a revised hire charge system (speak to the Bookings Team for full details). The general trend has been a small increase; however this is to bring all the different charges in line with each other.

The Centre has seen some refurbishment recently: approximately £10,000 has been spent on improvements, including new curtains, sanding, sealing and polishing the hall floor, fire regulation requirements, and new heaters. We are also looking at a hearing loop system at a cost of about £1000. Some of these improvements are due to legal requirements, but generally to improve the facilities available and make them more accessible and pleasant to use.

A recent concern of some villagers has been that the Village News is to be lost, in favour of an on-line version. There is absolutely no question of this. The intention is to make the Village News a part of the new web site, www.hagleyvillage.org. This will be completely secure, as any adverts or articles will appear exactly as they do in the paper version. There will be no email addresses or web links, unless requested, so no one can access private information or personal PCs.

HAGLEY SURGERY

You may have been aware that our Patient Participation Group (PPG) recently conducted a Patient Satisfaction Survey at the surgery. These are the results.

Satisfaction under each heading ranged from 71% (doctors' knowledge of Complimentary Medicine, willingness to refer for second opinion) to 98% (comfort of the waiting room, overall satisfaction with the doctor or nurse, explanations provided). Our scores were in line with the national averages.

From the free text, we have chosen to concentrate on the recurring themes. Unsurprisingly, one of these was the time between booking an appointment and seeing the doctor. This is a perennial problem throughout the health service. Public Finance means it is not feasible just to "get more doctors". Although we have continued to improve access, particularly by offering more hours, we have just kept pace with the increase in demand over the last 5-10 years.

The second recurring theme is that our patients seem to value the services of individuals rather than the practice as a whole. Because none of us are full-time, this pressurises appointments with individuals.

We are keen to improve perception of the practice by improving, but also by explaining why some aspects of the service have come about. As space here is limited, if you have any questions, please write in to the Practice Manager, and we will endeavour to answer some of them in future articles.

We owe our sincere thanks to the PPG for performing this survey on our behalf.



HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY

On Tuesday February 1st Mr. Spencer Tricket gave a talk on Witley Court – The House & Garden. A former home of the Earls of Dudley: the house was damaged by fire in 1937, but

most of the damage was inflicted by subsequent owners who ripped out anything of value. Narrowly escaping total destruction by the local council the house was made a listed building in 1972. Starting in the 1990s English Heritage has carried out extensive restoration work, in which Mr. Tricket has been involved. With the aid of slides he took us through a guided tour of the grounds and then a detailed examination of the ruined house. Pictures of the interior and exterior of the house, taken before 1914, were compared with contemporary photographs. A similar comparison was made with pictures of the two magnificent fountains, the Flora fountain and the Perseus & Andromeda fountain, for which the site is justly famous. Finally, Mr Tricket told us of the future restoration work they would like to carry out if the necessary funding can be obtained.

Neighbourhood Watch

During the winter we have seen T.V. commercials that the Home Office have produced to highlight how some people make life easy for criminals, these were humorous but Carrie a message that we should be aware of how easy it is to be a victim of burglary, car crime and robbery.

Programmes have highlighted home security, we may think our homes are well protected but do we always use our security well? Check security, update where necessary. Look at your property through the eyes of the criminal – how would you get in, could you be easily observed?

Last autumn the Sustainable and Secure Buildings Act was passed. This enables the introduction of building regulations that will further the prevention and detection of crime.

The new Act should make it possible for all new homes to have good security e.g. door and window locks in place when they are built. Homes without security are on average nine times more likely to be burgled.

Locally we have had vandalism causing worry and distress to elderly residents; cars damaged, garden ornaments broken, plants uprooted and scattered over frontages.
