

Dear Editor,

I read with interest Mr Brace's letter headed "Grid locked Hagley" in the May edition of the Village News.

Your readers may be interested to learn that I have been corresponding with Worcestershire County Council who is the Highway Authority for all adopted roads in the West Hagley/Hagley area excluding A456 which is presently the responsibility of the Secretary of State for Transport, about the unsatisfactory traffic conditions and congestion.

My latest letter of 8th April to Mr Rob Sykes, Chief Executive of Worcestershire County Council, asked inter alia what his Council was proposing to do to alleviate the situation and I quote:-

"It is abundantly evident that urgent positive action is required by the Highway Authorities concerned to provide additional highway infrastructure to remove the through traffic from the trunk road A456 and also from the village shopping street B4187 in West Hagley. Such a new road together with certain local highway improvements would alleviate the present traffic congestion in the West Hagley/Hagley area resulting from planning expediency and mismanagement in North Worcestershire over a considerable number of years. In managing traffic problems what please are the proposals of your Council for alleviating the present traffic congestion in West Hagley?"

I have yet to receive an adequate response as Mr Sykes has decreed that his officers are not to correspond further with me. Albeit I have written again to Mr Sykes and await his reply.



POLICING IN HAGLEY

For some time now we have been carrying out the Vulnerable Vehicle Scheme. It

involves officers on patrol looking into cars for items of value on display.

The aim is to combat vehicle crime across the area including Hagley village car park and shopping area. If officers see items on display, which may be attractive to thieves, they note the time, date, registration and details of the property. A letter and crime prevention pack are sent to the keeper explaining the initiative. Nothing is left on the vehicle to identify it as having property on display.

A large number of forms have been completed for Hagley suggesting people are not aware of the potential for theft. It takes seconds for a thief to smash a window or puncture a lock to remove property. They may park next to a vulnerable vehicle and while still in their own car, break into the target car. The passenger gets out, the offender's car is moved and the target is entered and property stolen.

We have seen computers, briefcases and bags of various descriptions, leather jackets, shopping (not groceries) and electrical items on display. We understand people leave things in their cars but we would like them to be placed out of sight and prior to parking if possible and when returning shopping, again if possible, put it in the boot.

With your help we can reduce crime still further!

GRANTS – THE EMILY LYTTLETON FUND AND UNITED CHARITIES

Grants to people of a wide age range are made to adults to help them in times of financial difficulty. The most recent payments have been made to the victims of crime, to help with winter fuel costs and to provide books for students.

The grants from the Emily Lyttleton Fund and United Charities are small and are paid to people living in Hagley, Blakedown and Churchill.

William Henry Lyttleton, Rector of Hagley from 1847 to 1884 set up the fund in memory of his wife, Emily. The object of the fund was provide a nurse for non-infectious cases and to act as a midwife. Four small charities, surviving from their 18th century origins, have been brought together and are now described as the United Charities.

Both the Emily Lyttleton Fund and the United Charities are operational today, further information being available from Mrs J Pardoe of 11 Park Road, Hagley DY9 0NS.







FROM ANOTHER TIME..... BROOME C.1850 - C.1920

'If ever we take up the clerical profession', observed a Victorian writer, 'commend us to Broome'. Nothing seemed to happen in Broome in 1850, and it was all the better for it. In the fields, mostly owned by the Earl of Dudley, wheat and barley grew. In the school, which no one had remembered to name, only 25 children were educated. In the church, built of brick in 1780, the Revd. J.G. Bourne could fit the whole village of 100 or so people. He could happily believe he fully earned his £320 a year – no one went to rival chapels, complaints about church rates were genteel. Broome House, now a care home, was built in the late 18th century. A nearby farm is of similar style and may possibly have been built around the same time. With its pool – alas now without its island – and carefully laid out gardens, Broome House is an attractive, tranquil place. A photograph from the early twentieth century shows a shooting party standing by the front entrance of the house. This was taken during the time the house was owned by Sir John Holder. Always immaculately dressed, Holder was a car enthusiast, often appearing at the Brooklands race track. He built a miniature railway in the grounds of Broome House, but this has long since been dismantled.
