Hagley Parish Council – Proposed Reduction in the Size of the Parish Council

For many years, Hagley Parish Council has consisted of 15 Parish Councillors, who have been elected to represent the views of local people and to take decisions on local issues.

However, in recent years, it has not been possible to fill all 15 places on the Parish Council, because not enough people have come forward to stand for election as Parish Councillors. Even when the Parish Council has tried to fill the vacant places by co-opting volunteers (without an election), it has not been possible to fill all 15 places.

Despite this, the Parish Council has, for several years, been able to function properly with a reduced number of Parish Councillors. Therefore it is proposed that, from the date of the next Parish Council Elections in May 2007, there should be a permanent reduction in the number of Parish Councillors from 15 to 13.

Before a decision on this proposal is taken, the District Council and Parish Council would like to seek the views of people living in the Parish. HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY

The talk on Tuesday July 5th was of special local interest as it was about the Kidderminster carpet industry. Mr Melvyn Thompson and Mr Richard Pugh-Cook presented the talk, entitled "Woven In Kidderminster". Mr Thompson described

the origins of the industry, from it's beginning in medieval times as a cloth weaving centre. The town became famous for the production of a heavy cloth known as "Kidderminster Stuff"; it was found that this material was suitable for making simple carpets and so the industry was born. Mr. Pugh-Cook described the technical innovations, which were introduced over the following centuries; these included the technique of weaving Wilton and Axminster carpet, the introduction of power looms and many other things. By mid 20th century the town employed 30,000 people in the industry at a large number of firms, however in the 1960s the introduction of tufted carpets, manufactured by a simpler and cheaper process, saw the demise of many companies. There are now about 1500 people working in the industry, which specialises in making high quality traditional woven carpet for heavy wear commercial use.

The next meeting of the Society is on Tuesday September 6th at which Mrs. Rae Fowler will talk about "Secrets of a Worcestershire Village (Burcot Uncovered)". Visitors and new members are all welcome at St. Saviour's Church Hall at 8.00 p.m. Visitors £1.50 including refreshments.


