

Thus again it begs the question, precisely how does Worcestershire County Council as local highway authority intend to resolve this problem of intolerable traffic congestion in West Hagley. Hopefully a substantial response from the local highway authority will now be forthcoming.







HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY

The meeting on Tuesday September 6th saw Mrs. Rae Fowler give a talk entitled, "Secrets of a Worcestershire Village (Burcot Uncovered). Mrs Fowler explained

how the talk had evolved from the researches carried out for a Millennium project to do a sort of modern Doomsday Book for the village of Burcot. The information unearthed provided an interesting history of the village; its buildings and some of its previous inhabitants. The talk was illustrated with a series of excellent colour slides showing many of the interesting buildings some of which dated from the 17th and 18th Centuries: some of the grander houses were built in the late 19th Century with the arrival of the railway which allowed wealthy Birmingham people to live away from the smoky city. Like many villages modern Burcot has seen great changes with the conversion of many farms and workers cottages into modern residences. Mrs. Fowler pointed out that despite constant references to Burcot as a village, it had no church and was therefore, technically, only a hamlet. It had once had a shop and a pub but now had neither. The next meeting of the Society is on November 1st at which Mr. John Hemmingway will talk about "Mapping The Past". Visitors and new members are all welcome at St. Saviour's Church Hall at 8.00 p.m. Visitors £1.50 including refreshments.


ART CLUB

CENTENARY CELEBRATION WEEKEND 17TH AND 18TH SEPTEMBER

The opening service of the Hagley Free Church was held on Saturday 16 September 1905, so this date determined that the main centenary celebration should be this particular weekend in September. On Saturday evening there was a gathering of 120 people for an informal evening with a buffet supper. Past and existing members and friends of the Church were present. Representatives of the Anglican churches in the locality joined us bringing Christian greetings.

On Sunday morning the service, in a packed church was led by Rev David Taylor, a Baptist minister currently based near Watford. David's association with the Free Church goes back over forty years, his father in law, Ian Ford, was a former Church President. When the Church was opened an American organ was purchased with the financial help of Andrew Carnegie, the American philanthropist and to demonstrate the potential of the organ, The Hallelujah Chorus was played. This time the Chorus was sung by an augmented choir. Also, a special hymn, written by the modern hymn writer Fred Kaan wa s sung. This hymn reflected the inter-denominational character of the Free Church and was a reminder of the services that Fred had taken at the Church in the past.

David Taylor in his address reminded the congregation of the nature of the Church. It was apostolic, meaning it was the conveyor of an eternal truth; it was prophetic, meaning it had a responsibility for the waywardness of all humanity: it was evangelical in that it sought to proclaim the love of God to all; it was pastoral in the way it cared for others and it had an educational role to pass on the traditions from one generation to the next.

At the end of the morning service children of the Sunday School released 100 balloons carrying messages from the Church. We look forward to hearing from those who find them! The evening service, which included the celebration of Holy Communion was conducted by a former member of the Church, Rev Rikki Twigg, now a minister of the United Reformed Church. The theme of the service was the need for us all to give thanks in our worship and from our worship to be enthused to serve a world of real need in the name of Jesus Christ. It was a weekend in which the centenary of the Church was truly celebrated and will serve as a springboard for the future witness of the Free Church.


