#### HAGLEY CUBS AND SCOUTS CHRISTMAS POST

The Hagley Cubs and Scouts will be delivering the Christmas post in Hagley village again this year, supported as always by Walton and Hipkiss. The 'Post' was set up many years ago as a way of involving the Scouts in providing a service to their community and earning some money to contribute to the upkeep of the Scout Hut.

The service covers all Hagley addresses and is a very convenient way of delivering those local cards that you can't quite justify posting but haven't got the time to deliver by hand. All you need to do is buy the special Hagley Rambler Scout stamps (12p each) from either Walton and Hipkiss or Cavendish Cleaners and then post your cards in the boxes that will be in Walton and Hipkiss, Cavendish Cleaners, Hagley Surgery and Hagley Library. (Note stamps are not available from the surgery or library). The boxes and stamps will be available from Monday 27th November and the final collections will be made from all boxes on Saturday 16th December at 12 noon. All the collections and sorting are done by a team of cub and scout parents and the boys will then help with the deliveries between 16th December and Christmas eve.

#### **DEAR EDITOR**

#### Dear Editor,

Having recently moved to this address, I have become increasingly concerned with the traffic in Church Street. As the road is so narrow, parking is only permitted on one side, and we and our neighbours have had cars parked outside our homes obstructing the driveways. Recently, we reversed off our drive only to be hit by a young lad coming down the road. Fortunately this time those concerned were all unhurt, but had this been a pedestrian crossing the road instead, then perhaps the outcome would not have been so lucky.

I find it quite amazing that Church Street is used as the main exit and entrance for Summervale Road, Milestone Drive, etc and also now the newly built homes at the back. The only other road out is by the traffic lights at the end of Summervale Road, which can only be entered via the right or exited only to the left, which means that anyone wanting to travel in the other direction has to use Church Street.

Aside from being the main road usage for half of Hagley, we also entertain the overflow parking for Hagley car park, especially on Saturday for the football. I feel that the speed for traffic in the road needs to be reduced, perhaps with speed humps and clear signage of the speed limit. Parking should be restricted and markings for designated parking spaces outlined clearly.

When we had the accident the road was blocked with the 2 cars, causing chaos to oncoming traffic. Should there have been a fire or accident and the emergency services needed to get by, then this would have been impossible. There needs to be alternative road access to assist with the flow of traffic, or the road leading out of Summervale needs to be reconstructed to allow traffic to enter and exit in both directions.

#### Welcome to our new Councillor

The Parish Council is delighted to announce that Mrs P Wilkins has been co-opted as a new Parish Councillor. We welcome Cllr Mrs Wilkins and look forward to working with her in the Parish.

#### Planning

As you are aware the Council comments on all the planning applications within the Parish. As Hagley is such a big village there are many applications. In September we looked at eleven applications, including the following where objections were raised.

B/2006/0801. 1 Eton Walk. Demolition of existing derelict bungalow and erection of new dormer bungalow. Objection: This proposal is far too big at this site and out of keeping with the estate.

Proposed H3G Telecommunications Base station at highways verge, off Hagley roundabout, between Park Road and Kidderminster Road.

Objection: Too close to the drinking fountain.

B/2006/0810. Land adjacent to 81 Sweetpool Lane, Reserved matters application for access.

Objection: proposals for access not satisfactory, this is a highly used footpath which is too long and narrow for vehicular access.

B/2006/0956. 2 Eton Walk. Change of use to dental surgery.

Objection: This is a residential area; any new dental surgery should be in the defined commercial area further down the road.

Copies of all planning applications for Hagley Parish can be viewed at the Parish Office.

#### **Alcohol Free Zones**

Please remember that Worcester Road, including the field and car parks, is an alcohol free zone. Persistent offenders will be prosecuted.

## HAGLEY VILLAGE SHOW



## HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY

Our speaker at the September meeting was Mr Rex Key who gave a talk on "Clay Pipe Makers of Brosely". With the introduction of tobacco into England in the late 16th century, smoking quickly became a popular pastime. The clay pipes required to smoke it

were fragile and quickly became blocked, consequently they only lasted a few weeks. This meant that they had to be manufactured in vast quantities. Mr. Key explained why Brosely became a centre for the industry. Situated in the new industrial area of the Ironbridge gorge it had the raw materials available (clay and coal) and the River Severn for transportation. The industry expanded and by the middle of the 19th century factories were producing millions of pipes per year: they were made manually by women who could each turn out up to 600 pipes per day; they were paid by the gross but were paid at a rate of thirteen and a half dozen to the gross to allow for breakages. The industry began to decline with the increasing popularity of cigarettes and the last factory closed in 1957; it has recently been renovated and reopened as a museum. Mr. Key finished his talk with a demonstration of pipe making using original Victorian tools.

The next meeting of the society is on Tuesday November 7th at which Mr. G. Hook will give a talk about "The World of Mother of Pearl". All are welcome at St. Saviour's Church Hall, Hagley, 8.00 p.m. Visitors £1.50 including refreshments.

We have had a very exciting start to the term at Haybridge with the news that, in terms of value-added data, which measures the progress that students make between Key Stage 3 tests aged 13 and the GCSE examinations aged 16, our GCSE results are the best we have ever had. 
