

2. This order shall come into force on 1st March 2007

3. The number of councillors for the Parish of Hagley shall be reduced from 15 to 13

Neighbourhood Watch

The A.G.M. held in December was poorly supported, members who attended wished the Watch to continue for the support their areas gave. It was thought that a daytime meeting might generate greater interest and encourage new residents to attend. I am in the process of arranging a date and venue for May.

Our speaker Mel Clarke, at the A.G.M. said that as there was no national Neighbourhood Watch, the divisional groups (we are within D Division for policing) are more locally driven by area interests and concerns. Hagley is a very low crime area but we suffer from targeted crime on cars, stolen or broken into for the navigation systems, and other valuables on display.

Recently a concerned resident contacted me about used drugs/medication-related materials which had been found on public land near the station and park. Was it a matter for the police or council?

I contacted both. Advised it was a matter for the council who have departments equipped to deal with the safe disposal and handling of such materials.

If you come across any materials which could be hazardous to health/safety phone Customer Services 01527 881286 who will inform the correct department. You will be asked for your name, address and the location of the items. Please ask Customer Services for your call reference number so that you can check that the objects have been removed.

Do report incidents to your local co-ordinator or myself so that we can keep active Watch areas informed of local concerns, theft, vandalism, unsociable behaviour etc.

HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY

Our speaker at the society's February meeting was Mr. Roy Albutt who talked to us about "Light & Colour - Our Heritage in Stained Glass". Mr Albutt described the processes involved in producing stained glass windows, an art

that had been perfected in the middle ages to create beautiful church windows. Some examples of these can still be seen in France such as at Chartres Cathedral. Very little English medieval glass survives intact due to the actions of the Church of England after the Reformation. The windows (and statuary) were considered idolatrous and were ceremoniously smashed. However the Gothic revival architecture of the 19th century created a demand for stained glass and several firms were established to supply it, such as John Hardman's in Birmingham, which still exists today. Later the Arts & Crafts movement became involved; examples of Burne-Jones stained glass can be seen in many local buildings. Mr. Albutt's special interest is in the stained glass makers associated with the Bromsgrove Guild, in particular R.J. Davies and A.E. Lemmon both of whom worked well into the 20th century. Mr. Albutt illustrated his talk with a series of excellent slides.

The April meeting of the Society is on Tuesday 3rd at which Mr. T. Keegan will give a talk on "Milestones and Their Preservation". All are welcome at St. Saviour's Church Hall, 8.00 p.m. Visitors £1.50 including refreshments. The April ramble is on Sunday 15th, starting from the village car park at 2 p.m.
