





Dear Editor,

I refer to my letter last month enclosing a copy letter to Mr Kevin Dicks, Chief Executive, Bromsgrove District Council.

As then promised I include below the relevant extract of his response which was awaiting my return from holiday:

"I have today chased Worcestershire County Council (WCC) Highways Partnership unit by forwarding the aforementioned letter and your earlier letter dated 16th November detailing your concerns regarding the traffic congestion in West Hagley.

I have requested, Mr John Hobbs, Director of Environmental Services at WCC request his officers look into your concerns and respond to you directly."

I will of course inform you of Mr Hobbs' response.

Traffic congestion on the road network in this area, including routes B4187 (the village shopping street) and trunk road A456, has resulted from an inadequate highway infrastructure and irresponsible uncoordinated planning in the wider North Worcestershire over a number of years.

Some 18 months ago the Hagley Parish Plan highlighted this traffic congestion. Having regard to Chapter 5, Highways, of that Plan and particularly the proposals listed therein to reduce road congestion, surely WCC as local highway authority in consultation with the Trunk Road Highway Authority for A456 should have been able by now to have devised and announced a programme of short and long term measures to alleviate the diabolical traffic congestion being presently experienced by the community of Hagley.

Dear Editor,

With so much in the papers about fortnightly waste collections and the problems with landfill sites, we would like to introduce ourselves, Katherine Chilvers and Helen Keegan; we are Master Composters - part of a team across Herefordshire and Worcestershire trained to promote home composting and to help you with any queries or problems you might encounter.

Composting is a good way of reducing the amount of rubbish that you put into your black bin every week. Over 30% of the average household's waste can be composted. So how do you start? Bins are available at reduced prices through this website and through the post; www.recyclenow.org.uk/home_composting. Helpful advice about composting is also on the website. However if you would prefer someone to come and talk you through the practicalities of setting up your compost bin, where it should be sited, what can and cannot be put into it etc, please give us a call and we will be more than happy to come and give you advice, or give you one of the offer leaflets.

As well as garden waste, your compost bin can be used to dispose of vegetable peelings, tea bags, cardboard, egg boxes, shredded paper and hamster and gerbil bedding. It all goes to help reduce the amount of rubbish you put out each time and you are left with a product that can help to make your garden beautiful at no extra cost. Happy composting!

Ordering of Repeat Prescriptions

Hagley Surgery and the Chemist would much appreciate your help in ensuring that the process of ordering your repeat prescriptions runs smoothly. Please be aware that it takes at least two working days to process your repeat prescriptions. Sometimes the process may take a little longer in which case the surgery will contact you in advance.

Please make it clear to the surgery whether you wish your prescription to be taken to the chemist for you or whether you wish to collect it from the surgery – it would be helpful if you put this clearly on the prescription slip rather than on envelopes.

It is important that you place your repeat prescription order in plenty of time, especially before your holidays.

The doctors are unwilling for staff to take requests over the telephone for safety reasons. The chemist and surgery work closely together and we aim to continue to provide an efficient service to you.

If you have any concerns or have experienced any difficulties please let us know. Many thanks.



HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY

At our May meeting on Tuesday 1st Mr. Alan T. Smith M.B.E. talked to us about "New Uses for Old Buildings". Mr Smith is a member of the West Midland Historic Building Trust. He described how after the end of the war the

re-building of our towns often resulted in the destruction of buildings of historic interest. In 1945 the Civic Trust was established to help preserve them. Local trusts were formed and suitable buildings were given listed status, which meant they could not be pulled down. These buildings cover a wide variety of types including Tudor houses, Victorian factories, redundant chapels and churches etc. The aim of the trusts is to preserve these buildingsand if possible to renovate them for re-use. The necessary funds are raised from various sources including local councils and the National Lottery. Mr. Smith showed us examples of the Trust's local work; these included the renovated half-timbered cottages in Kinver High Street and the Harris and Pearson building in Brettel Lane, Brierley Hill, now in use as modern offices. The Trust's present on going project is Corngreves Hall in Cradley Heath.

The July meeting of the Society is on Tuesday 3rd at which Mr. N. Williams will give a talk entitled "Banner Bright" (A history of banners used by churches and trade unions etc). All are welcome at St. Saviour's Church Hall 8 p.m. Visitors £1.50 including refreshments. The July ramble is on Sunday 8th, starting from the village car park at 2 p.m.







IS CHANGE A SIGN OF LIFE OR DEATH?

Andrew Marr in his recent TV series "History of Modern Britain" started with the premise that British society has experienced a major change during the period since the end of the Second World War, probably the greatest social change in any period of this country's history. He made the point that immediately after the war, a society which was lacking material comforts had optimism for the future. This is in direct contrast to our present society. We live in an age, which with all its material benefits, has a pessimistic outlook. Is there hope for the future?

HAMSTEAD ROAD BAPTISTS CHURCH, BIRMINGHAM

The honorary minister of the above Church, Rev David Tennant, has had a long association with Hagley Free Church. Besides taking services on a regular basis he has conducted infant dedications, weddings and funerals. His church at Hamstead Road is very different from Hagley. The congregation is representative of the inner city and the church premises are listed and large. They were built 125 years ago to serve an affluent part of an expanding Birmingham. In spite of difficulties Christian witness and worship continues in this deprived area.


