



PLANNING

In June, the Council looked at 6 planning applications and made the following comments:

B/2008/0462 - 38 Middlefield Lane. Proposed two storey side extension. No objection.

B/2008/0508 - 94 Kidderminster Road (Stratstone Garage). Various adverts. No objection.B/2008/0562 - 10 Middlefield Lane. Proposed rear single storey extension to form garden

room for use with patio. No objection.

B/2008/0567 - 12 Kinver Drive. Erection of a single storey rear extension to form sun lounge. No ojection.

B/2008/0551 - 12 Summervale Close. Single storey extension to rear to enlarge kitchen, loft conversion. Two storey extension to side to enlarge bedroom/bathroom accommodation. Internal alterations. Object, proposed loft conversion is out of keeping with the area and will adversely affect the privacy of neighbouring gardens.
B2008/0582 - 9-11 Woodland Avenue. Erection of three new dwellings: two four bed houses and one two bed bungalow. Object, this is a renewal application for planning permission, there is no need for these properties, which would be an unwelcome development in this residential area, creating too high a density of dwellings.

Much therefore to look forward to, and as always, if anyone would care to join us they would be made very welcome indeed.


