

HAGLEY TRAFFIC SURVEY

PACT meeting update

Residents expressed a concern over speeding traffic and congestion. Actions were agreed with the Camera Safety Partnership taking the lead to discuss concerns with County Highways, and

the key findings are summarised below.

Worcester Road junction of car park and bus stop

- Traffic averaged 74,000 vehicles per week in each direction; over 10,000 a day.
- Less than 3% were exceeding the speed limit.
- Northbound average speed was 27.8 mph and 30.2 mph for southbound
- Speeding mostly occurred in the evening and overnight.
- Nonetheless, several vehicles were measured at over 40 mph, over 50 mph and a few in excess of 56 mph.

Worcester Road in the vicinity of No.47

- Over 210,000 northeast bound vehicles and 200,000 southest bound vehicles per week.
- Around 21% of vehicles were shown to be exceeding the speed limit.
- Average speeds were 35.4 mph northeast bound and 35 mph southwest bound.

Kidderminster Road near traffic island

- Weekly traffic flow was 162,000 vehicles in each direction.
- The average speed was 45.7 mph northeast bound and 42.6mph southwest bound

Following the initial finds of the survey Hagley Parish Council submitted proposals for speed control. No response has been received but we will use the PACT meetings to raise the concerns again.

Worcestershire Acute Hospitals NHS Trust, which manages the Alexandra, Kidderminster and Worcestershire Royal Hospitals, is applying to become a Foundation Trust (FT).

Foundation Trusts remain part of the NHS, but have greater flexibility to respond to local healthcare needs and the financial freedom to deliver new services and facilities more quickly.

A key part of the Trust's FT bid is a recruitment drive to encourage local people to sign up as Members.

Membership is free and open to anyone aged 16 or over living in Worcestershire. Members can simply ask to be kept up to date with key developments at the Trust or they may wish to be more actively involved, by taking part in workshops or focus groups.

The FT will have a new body called the Council of Governors, working with the Trust Board to set a strategic direction and provide a voice for local people, as well as appointing the Trust's Chairman and Non-Executive Director. The majority of governors will be Public Governors, drawn from and appointed by Public Members.

OVERGROWN HEDGES

Now that the winter is here, we receive many complaints from pedestrians about trees and hedges overhanging the pavement. Please

check your own gardens to see if your trees or bushes are blocking the pavement or blocking the light from lamp posts and consider the pedestrians who may be using the pavement. In the event of persistent complaints, the District Council can give the householder 28 days to resolve the problem or they will step in and do it but charge the property owner for the work.







During November various activities were organised which included a Computing Sixth Form Conference at the University of Worcester; the annual National Competition for Mathematicians; Food Awareness Training for Primary School teachers (in order to develop their skills and confidence when working with food) and a Winter Jukebox.

Pupils have begun to prepare for Christmas by producing shoeboxes for the Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child campaign which ensures that suffering children across Central and Eastern Europe, Mozambique, Swaziland and Liberia receive Christmas gifts.








A Christmas Message


Christmas is a time when we usually like to pull out all the stops. We take time to send cards to virtually everyone we can think of, and we try to make this year's glitzy decorations better than the ones we put up last year. We take care to buy presents for friends and family that we think they'll really appreciate, and wrap them up lovingly and carefully in preparation for Christmas Day. We preface the day with office parties, and occasions for mulled wine and mince pies, and when the day itself arrives, it's Roast Turkey with all the trimmings – or perhaps something more exotic – and enough food and drink for an army.

Whether that represents how you keep Christmas or not, it's likely that this year many of us will be celebrating in a more modest way. The credit crunch and the financial crisis have ensured that. And if we are keeping Christmas rather more simply, maybe that's more in keeping with what we're celebrating – the birth of a baby in a stable, because there was no room in the inn, miles from home in an occupied country, with no home comforts. 
