VILLAGE INFORMATION

Worcestershire County Council Update

Kidderminster Road/Worcester Road Junction (A456/B4189)

Regarding the junction A456/B4187 Worcester Rd and Kidderminster Rd Traffic lights that was altered 2 years ago, a further meeting with County Council Officers and myself happened in late March. Five options where presented. There is one option that would restore to the previous layout (an extra lengthening of the shortened slip road and right only into the village.) with an additional split filter left and right at the lights from the village to the main road. Some of the other options are the split filter from the Village only with no other alterations; another is using the split filter with a larger in the road standing area at the crossing.

I have requested that S278 from the Strathearn Westen Road development might go to fund the first option I mention of roughly £200K. If this funding can be allocated or found elsewhere then disappointingly these major changes to the layout will not be done at the same time as the Severn Trent works this summer in the school holidays. I've been told given the time scales and amount of work it is not possible by county officers.

The parish council will have been consulted on with the proposals in April. (Information correct at the time of going to press)

Corner of Western Road and South Road

Several residents around Western Road and South Road have requested double yellow lines on this corner. These are to be installed to protect the junction so traffic can get round parked cars at the edge of the corner on both sides which prevent any large vehicles being able to negotiate the turning into South Road. There may be extra new signage at the top of Western Road but this has yet to be confirmed.

Worcester Road 2 hour waiting limit

There will be a 2-hour parking restriction instead of 1 hour from West One to the emergency access for Worcester Close (white lines opposite Spar), which will be implemented this summer. The 1hr limit will remain from the Spar to the Post Office/Hagley Stores. This gives flexible 1hr parking for nipping into the village at the shop end of the village that isn't then clogged up with 2hr parking. Clear signage will be installed.

Station Road and Park Road TRO April /May

Part-time restriction on Station Road at school drop off and pick up times will come into force at the end of April or early March 2017.

This also includes restricted parking along part of Park Rd too.

From the County council divisional fund 2016-17, £340 went to the Hagley Girl Guides towards a tent and £2600 for the flashing speed sign allocated for Bromsgrove Road.



A Snapshot of Sella

Sella, a Spanish village of 600 inhabitants is located in the Costa Blanca Mountains. Located one hour from Alicante and just forty-five minutes from Benidorm. The village is home to two bakeries, two shops, two banks, a pharmacy and a newsagent. In the first weekend of October, Sella celebrates its Festa Major, Festes de L'Aurora. But during the winter months, it's a sleepy hamlet for rock climbers and cyclists.

I'm no rock climber or cyclist, I can barely walk up a slope without getting out of breath, although located in the Mountains, Sella isn't just a destination for the thrill seekers. It's also a place for escapism from the growing concerns of tourism, a different perspective of life in Spain.

Stepping into Sella feels as though I have been transported to a different time, the church bell rings every half an hour and the smell of fresh baking bread saturates the street. Although Sella is home to a few English families, the rest of the citizens are Spanish-born, many born here tend to stay and have a family of their own. English is relatively unheard of here, so you will need to brush up on your Spanish, something I still need to learn. The air has a subtle warmth, and the sound of birds and a faint bark of the guard dogs is all that is present.

I'm woken up at 7 am, by the Church bell ringing, it rings twice so that the people in the mountains know that it's the first bell of the day. We wander down the streets of Sella to bar Casino to consume a Spanish breakfast. The table is laid out with a paper table cloth, and the waiters attentively produce our order. Crunchy toast with salted tomatoes inhabits my palate, my mouth moist from the fresh tangy orange juice, \in 5 a breakfast, with a cup of black tea. Our guide Terry Gifford author and poet begins a walking tour around the village where he lives a few months of the year. The houses are painted a distressed antique white and a tarnished sandstone orange, the sloping streets feel empty as you occasionally pass a Spaniard going about their daily tasks. The sun beats down onto my exposed shoulders and a gentle breeze dances with my hair.

I watch through the window as the old men from the village retire to the social club of bar casino, playing dominos and card games they laugh and chatter with each other in their native tongue. The women I would imagine start preparing lunch and dinner for when their men come home. The ladies have their own social club, normally in the morning with a cup of coffee.





Our Summer Term began on Tuesday 25th April, and we've got 11 rehearsals before breaking up for the Summer Vacation on Tuesday 11th July (this takes into account no rehearsal on 30th May for the schools' Half Term).

As always, we've selected a good mixture of musical styles from the baroque to the 20th century, and this includes a string 4tet as well as string orchestral music. The 4tet this term is by a little-known Bohemian composer named Johann Valhal (1739-1813), whose known mainly for playing cello in a string 4tet in 1784 led by Haydn with Mozart playing viola; the 2nd violinist was Dittersdorf, a great friend to Haydn, who was Valhal's teacher.

Our other works are by Albinoni, Arensky, Lenox Berkeley, Elgar, Faure and a Romance by Sibelius. The short Elgar piece Elegy is a very beautiful tribute, which he wrote in 1909 in memory of his great friend August Jaeger who had recently died of tuberculosis, aged 49. Most of us remember Jaeger as 'Nimrod' in Elgar's hidden portraits in the Enigma Variations (1899).

Hagley Historical and Field Society



It has been my experience and probably that of my parent's generation too, that domestic toilets were normally indoors. Many of the houses built in Hagley during the 1930's had an integral toilet but which was entered from outside. However, as a child I can just recall visiting an uncle who lived in rural Shropshire who had

an old house with stone flagged floors and no indoor toilet. His family used a 'privy' at the bottom of the garden which when built would have been regarded as state of the art and a great improvement on what went before.

And so it was, as we were told by our speaker this month Derek Clarke, that when the Birmingham Back to Backs in Inge Street were built in 1801 they were provided with three privies and two wash houses to cater for the needs of up to 100 people. As most of the neighbours both lived and worked at home these shared facilities made for a very close knit community. Both men and women were skilled craftspeople and were involved in metal, glass, wood and leather work. We know that there was a widow who worked as a pearl button driller and one Herbert Oldfield, a glass eye maker. The last remaining example of a Back to Back in Birmingham belongs to the National Trust and can be visited by appointment.

Our next meeting at St Saviour's Church Hall is on Tuesday 2nd May 2017 at 8.00pm. It is our annual Social Evening. There will be the usual refreshments followed by a presentation by member Eric Greenwood entitled "A Voyage Around My Grandfather – A Chauffeur's Tale".
