

Thicknall Rise

The photograph is of Thicknall Rise, a house designed by Tom Grazebrook whose father was John Phillips Grazebrook, a Black Country ironmaster. It was built in 1899 at the junction of Western Road and Newfield Road and was within Clent Parish until recent boundary changes.

It was the home of Frank Percival Evers and his wife Ellen. Frank was a solicitor at Harward and Evers, 118 High St Stourbridge. The fence on Western Road has an unusual inset; that is part of the driveway to the house. The Evers' second son Bryan G Evers was born in 1912, served at Dunkirk in WWII and was reported as missing in action. A memorial service was held at Broome Church, but he had been taken prisoner of war. He was awarded the Military Cross for his part in the action in which he was wounded. After the war he returned to Stourbridge to again practice law and later became Dudley's coroner. Bryan lived in the house until 1968.

It was later demolished, and houses were built on the site. The road named Thicknall Rise runs through what was the back garden area of the house.



Interview

Ten minutes in the company of Susan Merrill Hagley Art Club

If you're anything like me and sit in admiration of anyone that can put down on canvass what they see or what they imagine then the Hagley Art Club is one of the interviews that I'm really happy to bring you.

There feels to be more art programmes on TV than anytime that I can remember. Growing up watching Tony Hart and 'Hartbeat' and 'Take Hart' inspired me to do better at art but alas ability never really met ambition.

It's quite ironic that in a time that we can't get out to art exhibitions or museums the increase in art programmes and the increase in audience figures has grown. I suppose it just demonstrates what we've taken for granted and upon lockdown release the pent-up interest will manifest itself in more footfall through the doors.

I asked the current Chairperson of the Club, Sue Merrill, how it all started. "The Club started in 1989 and we celebrated our 25 years anniversary in 2014. The club itself was started by Alan Pritchard, which many residents will remember, with a small group of keen artists. Since then, we continue to have a good group of members with a wide range of skills from professional, keen amateur and new starters. Although Covid has caused some disruption including the cancelation of the 2020 Art Exhibition our members have stayed with us and we're planning our next exhibition around the middle of November 2021"

"In normal years we've been on visits and tours and one I particularly remember was a club trip to Paris to celebrate our 10 years anniversary. This is my 2nd stint as Chairperson, taking my total time in the chair as 10 years" added Sue. "Our Art Exhibitions held in the Community Centre have been a great success and acts as an opportunity for members to exhibit their work. Members don't need to be expert, competent artists, they only need to be enthusiastic. We're seeing more younger members coming through which will help the club grow and continue to survive. The club is there so that people can work on their particular subject matter and come together to exchange ideas and techniques. Some artists do sell their work whilst others just do it for their own interest."

How has technology and arts come together over the last year? I asked. "We've continued to do 'Zoom' meetings like everyone else and managed this quite well enabling us to have some of our demonstrators from other parts of the country. Our demonstration talks are with professional and semi-professional speakers which has increased interest in the club. COVID UPDATE The COVID vaccine clinics continue at both our Kidderminster Medical and Stourport Health Centre sites. We are successfully delivering the eagerly anticipated 2nd doses to those that received their vaccines in January and beyond. We are also proud to be continuing to offer first doses to those patients in lower groups. For both 1st and 2nd doses, patients will be invited via text message with a link to our online booking system and can choose a suitable appointment date and time to come to the vaccination clinics.

Appointments: We are continuing to operate a telephone appointment system at the surgery. For those patients who need to, we are still carrying out face to face appointments at the surgery and anyone that needs to come in will be offered this option if it is clinically indicated. This will be explained and a time mutually agreed between the patient and the clinician during the initial telephone call. All appointments (including telephone slots, nurse appointments for smears or blood tests) continue to be available to book online where you have access to your medical record. To sign up please speak to reception via telephone or our online portal on the website. You can access appointment booking or order repeat prescriptions at anytime from anywhere.

Some new faces: We are delighted to have welcomed Dr Chris Troth to the team at Hagley Surgery as a Partner. He is an experience GP and has worked in Solihull before joining us. He started on 8th March 2021. We have also welcomed Victoria as a new receptionist and Lorren as a new secretary. I am sure you will join me in extending a warm welcome to them all to Hagley.



Diabetes Prevention Programme

Tens of thousands of Herefordshire & Worcestershire residents at risk of Type 2 Diabetes are being encouraged to access free prevention support through the Healthier You NHS Diabetes Prevention Programme.

Living Well Taking Control, a new provider of the NHS programme, opened its doors in the area at the start of December 2020, offering the 9-month programme either immediately online through an app or through in-person group sessions once it's safe to do so amidst the coronavirus pandemic. Subscribers to the app will receive coaching and educational sessions from a specialist coach, who will monitor their progress and work with them to make healthier lifestyle choices and significantly reduce their risk of developing diabetes.

Participants who choose to take part in the group programme will meet fortnightly with a peer group of other residents going through the programme and receive education and support from their coach in local venues. The risk factors of Type 2 Diabetes are

wide-ranging, with everything from BMI and lifestyle choices through to ethnicity all contributing to the potential risk to a person of developing the disease.

If you would like to know whether you are at risk, LWTC have developed an online "Know Your Risk" tool, which uses answers to a series of questions to generate a "risk score", which is available at www.lwtcsupport.co.uk/ know-your-risk-tool. Alternatively, residents are encouraged to speak to their GP and ask if they qualify as at risk and therefore eligible for referral onto the programme.

Here are some springtime thoughts from John Oakes, a former Chairman.

Bluebells, my mother's birthday flower, are in full bloom now. Many woods in Worcestershire to visit, name but a few, Clent Hills, Croome Park, Wyre Forest, Beacon Wood, Lickey Hill, Chaddesley Corbett wood. Together with the white wild garlic, a picture to behold.

I get quite excited, like a child almost, when seeds germinate. Its nature's miracle, and seeds sown in April will now have germinated and growing well in seed trays or later sowings in the warmer soil. Michael Johnson-Ellis has been a UK Surrogacy and Fertility Treatment advocate since 2015 when he and his husband (Wes) embarked on their first journey with their daughter (Talulah) who was born in 2016. Their son Duke was born in August 2019. Since having Talulah, Michael and Wes have set up TwoDads.U.K (www.TwoDadsUK.com) which essentially was a light hearted way to raise more awareness about Surrogacy and Same Sex Parenting via Facebook and Instagram. It now has a combined following of over 40k and is the go to organisation for Surrogacy for the LGBTQ community.

Michael has campaigned for law reform and policy change. He and Wes have successfully challenged every NHS Trust to improve their policy surrounding the treatment of Surrogates and Intended when navigating Parents through maternity services. They were invited to the Houses of Parliament in 2018 to advise on where the laws needed updating. In 2019 Michael and Wes launched The Modern Family Show, the only LGBTQ family building event taking place in London this September. As spring rolls into summer the move into the early stages of the road map of lockdown brings welcome relief for us all. There is still much to be done as we look forward with optimism to July.

The first steps to recovery enabled people to meet outdoors which has resulted in the playing fields and main shopping area becoming heavily littered at times and the bins becoming full more quickly. If litter cannot be placed in a bin without it falling out, please take it home or find an emptier bin.

We ask that you bear with us whilst we allow the new young grass to establish properly on the playing fields. The area remains fenced off by the contractor while cultivation and mowing continues into the summer months, also allowing the ground to firm up. Please keep off the area in order to protect it from any unnecessary damage mid-reinstatement.

The government is looking at when it will be safe to hold Council meetings again in public. There remains a lot of uncertainty and this does not sit comfortably with many and raises issues of continuing to ensure everyone will remain safe. Necessary tree work has been undertaken in the playing fields as part of the tree management programme and of course the reversion of the A456 and B4187 is underway, unfortunately causing some disruption. However, once completed the works will reduce standing traffic and improve safety.

The Dial-a-ride bus is now running again. Anyone who has a bus pass, has difficulties with mobility or lives too far away from the amenities and bus routes should enquire about registering to use this service. It is run by an experienced community bus operator and is Covid-19 safe.




