#### HAGLEY HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY

On 4th July we once again welcome Dr Gillian White presenting 'Queen Victoria: A Life in Portraits'. Queen Victoria is popularly remembered as an austere, dowdy, and petite widower (she was only 4ft 11in), however, she succeeded in projecting different and memorable images using paintings and photographs throughout her long life. This lively and entertaining talk will take us on her journey from daughter to empress, by way of wife, mother and dog-owner, with her ever-changing role on Britain's stage carefully captured and controlled for both public and private consumption. We will follow her story in a selection of these portraits – some familiar, some perhaps surprising - and see a winsome toddler develop into a symbol of the nation.

We meet again on 5th September when we welcome Michael Loftus presenting 'Mr Mitchell's Quite Wonderful Wall'

If you've driven in Kidderminster, you're sure to have noticed the extensive concrete relief decorating the retaining wall from Worcester Cross to Worcester Road Ring Road. William Mitchell (1925-2020) was a prolific and

innovative architectural sculptor who worked in various materials but most notably concrete. Mitchell was particularly keen to give the wall elements which passers-by might find attractive and interesting. Mr Loftus and fellow members of the Civic Society campaigned for the 'Great Wall of Kidderminster' to receive listed status and after years of neglect, it is now recognised for its artistic merit and was awarded Grade II status in 2020. One of the detailed panels designed to provide a backdrop for a waterfall was also reinstated in 2021, bringing happy memories to many in the town.

The society's meetings which are held at 8pm in St Saviour's hall on the first Tuesday of each month. Visitors are most welcome at all our events.



#### HAGLEY STRING ORCHESTRA

King George V died just before midnight on 20 January 1936. The German composer Paul Hindemith (1895-1963), who was well-known as a viola soloist, had arrived in London the day before to give the broadcasted premiere of his Viola Concerto with Sir Adrian Boult. Due to the King's death, this concert was cancelled and Boult asked Hindemith to compose a short 4-movement memorial work which he called 'Trauermusik' ('Funeral Music').

Hindemith was given a room by the BBC and he wrote this piece from 11.00 am to 5.00 pm for string orchestra with viola solo which he himself played at the broadcast that same evening – a 'rush job'! Lasting about 6 minutes, it is in four movements ending with the Chorale 'Here I stand before Thy throne' which had been harmonised by JS Bach. HSO's Principal viola player, Geoff Leigh, is our soloist. HSOs music for this term ranges from the 17th century to Hindemith which gives us

plenty of enjoyable variety. Our Autumn Term starts on Tuesday 05 September, 10.00 am in the spacious hall behind Hagley Free Church. If you're a string player, please join us.



#### HAGLEY COMMUNITY CENTRE

You will have seen in the May VN that we're starting to promote proposed plans for the community centre building. The proposal is a mix of re-build, extensions, and refurbishments.

This represents a very important time for the community centre and we're seeking support from as many sources as possible. The images and plans give some ideas of the direction of travel of what we'd like to see the community centre develop into.

These are aspirations, which we'll be gauging how far we can go to meet them over the coming months. Funding will be the key to the delivery of a new centre, which aims to offer wider opportunities for community use

and community inclusion. We'll be consulting with stakeholders across the community and considering all options open to us. We'll be aiming to put the plans out on display in the Library and in the community centre with an opportunity for comments to be left for our attention.

# PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP (PPG) HAGLEY DOCTOR'S SURGERY

At the time of writing the Wells Pharmacy has returned to normal and issues related to unscheduled and unannounced closures have been resolved. I joined a meeting with Wells management, the surgery management and NHS representatives to discuss these issues. The meeting went well with all parties being open and honest with positive actions being taken as a result. We were assured that the reasons for the closures and loss of service have been addressed and the branch now returning to normal opening. There are now two-way direct links between regional management, the surgery, NHS

and me so that these and any other issues that might arise can be tackled quickly and with minimum disruption. The issue over clarifying the repeat prescriptions process has been raised with me. I have taken this up with the surgery and asked them to make ordering repeat prescriptions much clearer.

The group is in the process of writing its next newsletter which will be circulated in public places such as the library and surgery itself.

#### HAGLEY NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Sometimes the simple good old fashioned steps can be just as effective as modern surveillance and alarm systems.

If you're away from home for any length of time, just mention it to a few neighbours and ask them to keep an eye on your property when you're away. They'll welcome you doing the same for them when they're away, I'm sure.

Other simple measures are to leave a couple of lamp lights on if you're out after dark, make sure the shed is locked and of course, simply remove valuables from vehicles and activate your intruder alarms when you're away. Prevention is always better than cure.

There have been a couple of incidents involving drug-driving and inappropriate speeds in and around estate roads. Although not speeding over 30mph driving too quickly on residential roads is unnecessary and potentially could have fatal consequences as more children playout side over the summer months.

Such incidents have been reported to 101 and the Police will be investigating. As a reminder, it is important to report these and similar incidents to 101 so that a log can be built up and evidence gathered.

#### HAGLEY VILLAGE ALLOTMENTS

July is a wonderful time in the garden and at the allotment. Summer is now in full flow, and you'll be beginning to reap the rewards of all the hard work you've been putting in.

But all that lush summer abundance can turn to chaos if you don't stay on top of things. Here is some advice from the Hagley allotmenteers:

- Keep up with watering and keep on weeding says Plot 31. Plants need more water than ever at this time of year and being "water wise" will certainly help. Mulch around your plants to reduce moisture loss from the soil or use a drip irrigation system. As for weeding, little and often is generally best.
- For those strawberry growers at home and on the plot, Plot 30's advice is to use straw underneath your plants. This gives the fruiting bodies a nice, comfy bed, helps to stop any bruising or sitting on wet soil.

- Plot 18 says to reap the rewards from fruit trees and bushes, master pruning in conjunction with the seasons. Pruning at the wrong time could see you losing harvests before they have begun.
- Don't be afraid to ask for help or advice, in the garden or on the plot. Ask your neighbour or pop a plea on the Love Hagley Facebook page.
- Plot 10a gives us reassuring advice to not feel overwhelmed when taking on an overgrown plot or if the garden feels like a daunting task.
   Break it down into small, achievable tasks and do a bit at a time. Think about what's going to benefit you in the short term and start that.



#### **HAGLEY PROBUS CLUB**

The meeting of Hagley Probus Club, held on Monday 22 May, was addressed by Max Hunt, a self confessed Petrol Head. His topic was "Herbert Austin, The Longbridge Story". Born in 1866, Herbert became an apprentice engineer, working in Melbourne for the Wolseley company manufacturing sheep shearing equipment. In 1893 he returned to England as Engineering Manager of the UK division of the company. In 1896 he designed the first Wolseley automobile which successfully completed a 1000 mile trial. In 1905 he formed the Austin Motor Company and started production in a disused factory at Longbridge..The company expanded rapidly, manufacturing armaments in 1914 including a biplane. By the end of the war the company employed 22,000 employees, mostly Belgian refugees, who were accommodated in the purpose built Austin Village. Then came the first people's car, the legendary Austin Seven

Ruby Saloon. Production was interrupted by the Second World War when manufacturing turned to Hurricanes, Lancaster bombers and gliders as well as armaments. Herbert Austin died on 23 May 1941 and is buried in Lickey church. Following a bewildering series of name chances, coupled with a militant workforce, the company went into administration in 2005 and production finally ceased in 2016.

#### **SCOTT EXPLORER BELT EXPEDITION 2022**

Three members of Hagley Explorer Scout Unit successfully undertook an Explorer Belt expedition to Normandy in France last August.

They are Will Evans, Sam Riley and Luke Jones and are shown here receiving their awards from Lauren Wheeldon Hereford and Worcester Scouts County Deputy Commissioner 14+, after making their formal presentation.

The Explorer Belt is one of the highest expedition awards a member of Scout movement can accomplish and involves 50 plus hours of trekking in a foreign country over 10 days. It also involves fund raising, physical training, navigation, expedition cooking, team work and first aid amongst the skills and competences that must be achieved before undertaking such an expedition.

The team started in Cherbourg and finished in Dieppe, Normandy. They undertook various projects along the way the main one being a study the D-Day Landings, which involved visiting many of the museums, landing beaches and war cemeteries along the route.

Other projects included studying the Bayeux Tapestry, cooking a typical French meal for leaders, cider production and meeting local Scouts. The award is achieved when they successfully make a presentation to leaders, parents and guests.

One of the main purposes of such an expedition is to enable young people to understand the culture, way of life and to meet local people in a different country.

Over 20 Hagley Explorers have undertaken such expeditions over the years to Denmark, Holland, Germany and now France, all of which have been extremely successful. It is an achievement and experience they remember for the rest of their lives.

#### SCOUTS SIX SUMMITS CHALLENGE EXPEDITION

On Saturday 29th April, eight scouts (all aged between 13 and 14) from Hagley's Walton Troop took on the Six Summits Challenge - a 3-day expedition hike covering 36 miles and a total ascent of over 7500 feet. The hike is made all the more challenging as the scouts are required prepare their own route cards and maps in advance, hike with full kit, navigate the route unaided, undertake navigation and map read challenges en-route, put up and take down their own tents, and cook their own food on small gas stoves.

The first day started warm and dry and our two teams (Hagley A and Hagley B) set off, climbing the deceptively steep Corndon Hill and then on to Stiperstones before making camp in a muddy field at Medlicott. The scouts made great time, coming through the Day 1 finishing line as the two fastest teams. Shortly after reaching camp, the weather turned grim - wet, cold and windy - but the scouts cracked on with their camp and cooking tasks with no complaints, unaided by the Walton Troop leaders who were busy munching through an Indian takeaway very graciously provided by Mr Chris.

Day 2 of the hike is the hardest day of the challenge - the scouts must get up early, cook breakfast, pack away tents, prepare lunch, and get gear ready before setting off. All of this was made much harder because of the poor weather but once again the scouts got on with things, being well organised and ready in plenty of time. The Day 2 route is tough - a long 17 miles with climbs over the Long Mynd and Caer Caradoc thrown into the mix - before finishing at another very muddy field at Tugford for an overnight camp. Walton Troop leaders manned the checkpoint on Long Mynd and took the opportunity to prove that no amount of wind or rain was going to get in the way of cooking a bacon butty and making a brew. Again, Hagley A and B made excellent time over the route and managed to crack on with their camp setup and cooking, supporting and cajoling each other, before the poor weather set in for the night.

On Day 3 the teams had the small luxury of a lie-in before once again cooking breakfast, preparing lunch, and packing everything away for the final slog over Brown Clee and on to the finish line after a lung-busting climb up Titterstone Clee Hill. The weather improved and once again both teams made quick progress - reaching the final climb an hour earlier than we had expected given the poor underfoot conditions. 8 muddy, weary but happy scouts were met by their proud parents and Walton Troop leaders at the top of Titterstone for photos, rounds of well-earned applause, many hugs, and promises of Starbuck's coffee for the journey home.

This was truly a challenge, and a perfect example of what scouting is all about spending time in the great outdoors, tackling challenges head on, testing boundaries, supporting fellow scouts, and building great friendships. As leaders it is a huge honour and privilege to be able to see a group of young people prove that "a scout has courage in all difficulties" and play a small part in helping them achieve their full physical, intellectual, and social potential as individuals and responsible members of their community.

#### HAGLEY TO WORCESTER TRAINS

At the May 2023 timetable change the off-peak direct Hagley-Worcester train service was removed. Train travel from Hagley to Worcester now usually requires a change of train at Kidderminster, which is both unnecessarily inconvenient and increases the journey time by 50%. Trains to/from Worcester now pass through Hagley twice an hour in each direction without stopping. At the same time Hagley train services have been diminished in other ways. The number of trains per hour in each direction is reduced from three to two and the once-a-day direct service to London is removed.

The Stourbridge Line Users Group ('SLUG') is actively campaigning to reinstate off-peak direct trains Hagley to Worcester. In

2015, the previous occasion when direct Hagley-Worcester services were axed, SLUG campaigning (and common sense) soon led to reinstatement of direct Hagley - Worcester services in subsequent timetables. SLUG is in discussion with West Midlands Trains and has tabled a proposed revised timetable which would reinstate direct Hagley - Worcester trains, but which would also - it seems - satisfy all interested parties without adverse effects elsewhere.

SLUG is a group dedicated to improving public transport, particularly on the rail service between Birmingham and Worcester and thus through Stourbridge and Hagley. More details about SLUG including how to join are at www.stourbridgelineusergroup.info


