UPCOMING MEETINGS On 6th February we welcome Paul Timmins presenting 'The Nine Client Worthies'.

The 'Nine Worthies' is a concept from medieval chivalry, with nine historical individuals chosen to embody ideal virtues. In 2013, The coats of arms of the 'Nine Client Worthies' were selected to adorn Client Parish Hall from nine families who have contributed to the life of the village over many generations. Paul will tell the story of the coats of arms and the families they represent.

On 5th March we welcome Alan Peace presenting 'Himley Hall, Past, Present and Future' For many years, Himley Hall belonged to successive Earls of Dudley. The Hall began as a Hunting Lodge and after many redevelopments it steadily grew into the

grand house we see today. Between 1920 and 1936 it was so grand that Edward, Prince of Wales, later to become King Edward VIII, frequently visited the house for weekend shooting parties, he also made use of the indoor swimming pool, which was equipped with a water chute and cocktail bar! Alan will share the stories of the house and park, gathered over 27 years' experience as a Himley Park Ranger.



The 2024 season starts in about March next year. The end of the 2023 season doesn't mean that the beekeeper does nothing; managing ten hives is a whole day's work every week of the year, so while the workload is reduced there's always a job to do. Once a month you visit the apiary and check if everything is as you left it. There's hives to make or repair, frames to make-up, queen excluders to clean and lots of reading to do. HAGLEY VILLAGE ALLOTMENTS

Welcome to February. The winter brassicas should have been at their peak and a good frost would have sweetened up those parsnips, swedes and turnips. Hopefully you also had time time to plant garlic and rhubarb and if the ground wasn't too hard, to also plant bare-root fruit trees and bushes.

If you fed your soil with well-rotted organic matter, pulled up any perennial weeds and then covered for protection then you should you will benefit from the following:-

- Weed suppression
- Protection from heavy rain
- Warming the ground for spring
- Prevention of nutrients being leached
- Frost protection

Thinking and planning for the next growing season, reflecting on what worked well and what didn't work so well, re-planning and working out crop rotation and any other structural changes, like adding an extra bed or some arches for vertical growing should all stand us in good stead for the work ahead.

HAGLEY NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

During 2024 I would like to establish a group to form a Community 'Street Watch'. This is a community led watch scheme which allows you to make a difference where you live. It is made up of groups of volunteers who carry out street walks but have no police powers. It allows local people to help improve the neighbourhoods they live in by walking their own streets and providing visible reassurance and appropriate engagement in local issues that matter most. The groups are managed by a coordinator, who keeps a volunteer list, provides advice, guidance and support and is usually the contact that speaks with the local policing team. If you would like to be part of this group. please contact me. I'm also exploring ways of introducing Community 'Speed Watch'. This is a community driven road safety

initiative, coordinated by West Mercia Police but managed and run by volunteers in the community. The trained volunteers from the community monitor the speeds of vehicles with approved, hand-held speed measurement devices. Where vehicle speeds are found to be inappropriate, a letter is sent to the registered keeper by the police with the aim of encouraging them to reduce their speed when driving in the future. Again, if you're interested in getting involved, please contact me. I'm also looking at ways in which youth outreach provisions can be introduced into Hagley. I feel that there is a lack of youth engagement within our community. I will keep you posted on any progress.

HAGLEY COMMUNITY CENTRE

At January's AGM we reflected on an increasingly busy year and some of the achievements, as well as the successful setting up of the monthly Village market. A Chairman's report was received along with reports from the treasurer, Maintenance officer, bookings officer, Village News Editor, and an update in respect of the 'Future look of the centre'.

Since becoming the Chairman, it has struck me that we have a strong and tight knit committee who continue to support each other and have a determination and commitment towards the Community Centre. I thank all committee members for their hard work and commitment and for their help and support.

We heard that over the last year we have made several repairs and upgrades to the heating, lighting and safety of the building. Bookings remain healthy, although there is availability of both the hall and committee room at certain times of the week. The Village News continues to grow in content and is a very important source of income for the centre. The advertising revenue ensure that the magazine is free, and surpluses go straight into the Community Centre's working balances.

The Village Market has grown from a couple of ideas into a major community event regularly seeing 600 to 700 people visiting it each month. In turn the receipt from the traders means that it is on course to bring over £4,000 towards the centre.

We welcomed comments from the public attendees, and we shared our committee's thoughts and plans for the future of the centre.

HAGLEY SURGERY PPG

At a recent meeting of the PPG, we met with the Doctor's Surgery management team and senior Clinician. We discussed the latest Newsletter and I very pleased to know that printed copies are available at the surgery and at locations in Hagley such as the Library and various Churches. We also discussed the recent changes to the triage system and welcomed the news that it is going well and is greater efficiency and effectiveness to managing patient needs. It is being rolled out slowly and it is hoped that in time it will become second nature when contacting the surgery for your patient needs. We briefly discussed Government initiatives to introduce 'Pharmacy First services' to Pharmaceutical services. This is designed to take some pressure off Surgery Practices by empowering Pharmacies to be able to diagnose and treat minor ailments, such as minor eve infections, minor skin infections, insect bites. A meeting is being arranged with Well Pharmacy and further details will be made available in the premises and I'll provide further information ASAP in this update. Over the last year I'm please to report that the PPG has welcomed more members and has raised its profile within the Hagley community. I thank the editor of the Village News for allowing me to write my monthly updates here. Many thanks to the members of the PPG for their interest and support during the last year, without their continued hard work and drive this very important group would not be able to be a valuable part of the Doctor's Surgery.

TELEGRAPH POLES PROPOSALS

HAGLEY RESIDENTS RAISE CONCERNS ABOUT PROPOSALS TO INSTALL TELEGRAPH POLES FOR BROADBAND SERVICES.

Residents in Western Road and in other parts of Hagley have raised their concerns with County Councillor Karen May about a proposal by BRSK -a broadband provider to instal large telephone poles in their roads to provide broadband speeds of up to 1GB.

This initiative only became obvious when sub-contractors were recently seen marking positions for placing the poles on pavements in Western Road and other roads in Hagley.

Cllr Karen May invited Hagley residents to a meeting in Hagley Free Church on 11th December. Councillor Steve Colella attended together with two Officers from Worcestershire County Council, and a number of representatives from BRSK.

BRSK gave a presentation. They explained that their surveys had not yet been completed and where possible they would use existing underground facilities, and existing telegraph poles providing they would be allowed to do this by the current broadband providers.

There was a strong and forthright debate. Many residents objected to the use of poles carrying wires back and forth. It was seen as a retrograde step compared to using underground ducts and piping. Also, current providers such as Openreach and Virgin were already offering up to 1GB broadband speeds using existing infrastructure. However, some residents welcomed the development where current providers were unable to increase broadband speeds.

Cllr Karen May gained assurance from BRSK that when they had completed their surveys, they would meet with her and Councillors Steve Colella and Ruth Lambert to discuss their proposals. In turn, Cllr Karen May said that she would call another public meeting so that these proposals could be fully aired. Once Hagley residents were fully aware of the proposals and of any potential negative visual impact of poles in their roads then they would consider forming a strategy to object in the strongest manner possible. Residents should raise their concerns and comments with Councillors May, Colella and Lambert - contact details are in the back of the Hagley Village News.



HAGLEY PARISH COUNCIL

As we progress through 2024, we would like to recap on some of the work that Hagley Parish Council contributes towards looking after the interests of Hagley and you, our residents. We can't list everything in this article as the space is limited, so please use our website as a main point of reference. Sometimes, it's easy to forget what a great community we have and without that spirit it would be harder for the Clerks and the Councillors (all of whom are volunteers), to achieve results.

From a very small percentage of your Council Tax contributions, it allows us to finance various services that benefit all of us. We work with the County Council to keep the library operating and ensure that The Hagley Community Bus runs to Stourbridge, Kidderminster and Longbridge. We take care of the play equipment on the playing field, employ a ground maintenance team who keep the cemetery and playing fields tidy. We have a litter picker who covers the playing fields, shopper car park and the main shopping street, and of course we continue to look after the street lighting that falls within our remit and manage the allotments for the pleasure of residents. There are more details about all of this and other projects on our website.

The Pavilion is available for community groups to hire outside of West Hagley FC's use. Our offices are based in the pavilion and the office hours are 9am - 2pm, Mon - Fri.

HAGLEY STRING ORCHESTRA

Samuel Coleridge-Taylor (1875-1912) was born in London to mixed race parents. His father. Daniel Taylor, who was from Sierra Leone and descended from African-American slaves. studied medicine in London where he met. but did not marry, his English girlfriend Alice. He returned to his home-land not knowing that Alice was pregnant with a son, whom she named after the poet Samuel Taylor Coleridge. Alice's father paid for Samuel's violin lessons and for his study at the Royal College of Music where he also studied composition. On graduating, Samuel taught at Crystal Palace and conducted an orchestra in Croydon. Elgar supported him and August Jaeger (who inspired 'Nimrod' in The Enigma Variations) called Samuel 'a genius'. Aged 29 Samuel married a fellow student from the RCM and had a son named Hiawatha. This inspired his first major composition Hiawatha's Wedding Feast and increasing fame, leading to tours to the United States, where he was received by President Roosevelt. Despite this

success, Coleridge-Taylor struggled financially, this debilitating stress led to pneumonia and his death at the young age of 37. We are playing his 4-Movement Novelletten for string orchestra which Samuel composed in 1903 when he was 28. This work's UK Proms premiere was as recent as last September, so perhaps HSO is a 'trail-blazer'!



HAGLEY PROBUS CLUB

In November Sue Clegg, a retired police inspector gave a talk at our Hagley Probus Group meeting. The subject was "Fingerprints", an investigative technique at which Sue was the first female expert in the country. Sue first outlined the science underlying the technique used to identify criminals. The rationale behind the method relied on the fact that no two people, not even identical twins, had the same skin pattern on their fingers. By identifying 16 markers and characteristics of any fingerprint over 4,000 billion permutations were possible, hence the very high accuracy of the technique. This unique characteristic was recognised by ancient civilisations who used thumbprints as a means of confirming contracts and payments.

The national register of fingerprints contains only those prints of convicted felons and can be scanned to identify any re-offender whose prints are found at a crime scene.

Sue illustrated the use of fingerprints in convicting the criminals in 2 investigations on which she worked, namely Donald Neilson the "black panther" who abducted and murdered Lesley Whittle and Michael Sams who kidnapped Birmingham estate agent Stephanie Slater. Although Sams was identified by his wooden leg, he was convicted on fingerprint evidence.


