HAGLEY PARISH COUNCIL

As referenced back in the August edition, we are now pleased to announce that major works at Sweetpool Nature Reserve are complete. The Reserve has undergone guite an overhaul after we secured £15.846 from the UK Government through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund. With the funding we were able to replace the old railway sleepers and derelict handrails with two new 1.2m wide boardwalks with new railings. The one to the Sweetpool end of the reserve features a viewing platform for people to enjoy the peace and tranquillity that the area offers whilst looking out for wildlife. The boardwalk nearer to the Meadowcroft side of the reserve will take you right across the marshy land to the back of reserve where there are piles of cut logs from trees and an open area to enjoy. The log piles will become home to many insects, amphibians, small mammals and birds. Bird boxes, bat boxes and a Tawny owl nesting box have been installed on the site so keep a look out for them being used in due time.

The meadow at the top of the site will be managed more sensitively from next year with a cyclical management of the tussocky grassland margins and some ground preparation of the meadow for planting wildfl wer seeds next Autumn. The site has much historical and ecological value that needs conserving and has the potential to become classified as a Local Nature Reserve and/or a Site of Specific Scientific. Interest if it meets the Natural England criteria that HPC will be working towards. It is also planned for the site to be used for field studies by Haybridge Biology students and some DofE students will be

undertaking various activities and projects there to learn new skills whilst contributing voluntary hours to help again their award and helping to preserve and enhance the biodiverse nature of the area (subject to HPC approval). Users of the area can also partake in citizen science activities by recording sightings of wildlife by clicking on the QR code on the 'Wet Woodland Wander' Information lectern and completing the online form. Management and inspection of the site will be increased via contracts held by Hagley Parish Council and we ask you, the resident, to help us conserve the area for new visitors by:

- Keeping your dog on a lead and picking up after it
- Picking up litter and taking it home with you
- Reporting any anti-social behaviour or anything unusual to 101 or 999.

We hope the area will be enjoyed by many. Please contact the Clerk for further information or any ideas you have to improve the area. If you would like to look at ways to improve the biodiversity of your land, please get in touch!

Finally, Happy Christmas to all our residents and we'll see you in 2026!! Our office will close on 18th December and will open on 5th January

HAGLEY PROBUS CLUB

Members and guests of Hagley Probus Club were treated to a talk entitled "Cameo Glass" by Kate Round, an Outreach presenter and tour guide for Dudley Museum Service. Cameo glass is produced by applying a film of white glass on top of a coloured base and then removing part of the film to reveal a design or image in relief.

The first known example was the Portland vase- now housed in the British Museum-thought to be 2000 years old and found in a tomb in Rome. Its method of production baffle English glass makers for 500 years and it took the likes of John Northwood, the Woodall brothers, Partgeter, Richardsons and Webb many years to reproduce a copy of the vase. Originally using hand tools to create the pattern, power tools and sand blasting techniques are now employed.

Helen Willard and Terri College are two talented modern artists who can be seen demonstrating the art of cameo glass making at the Red House Glass Cone in Wordsley. It is impossible in a few words to do justice to the beauty of cameo glass and the skill involved in its manufacture.





HAGLEY PATIENTS PARTICIPATION GROUP

Hopefully many of our readers, residents and patients of the Hagley GP Doctor's Surgery will have responded to the Bromsgrove District Council Draft Local Plan Consultation over the summer which closed on 20th October.

Following discussions between the members of the PPG and meetings held with the senior GP Surgery Management Team the PPG has submitted its own response. This response outlined the significant risks to the impact of the proposed housing target on the capacity of the Victoria Passage surgery. The surgery patient list is growing by almost 1,000 new patients per year and reaching its capacity as well as the site itself being constrained and

unable to expand safely and adequately to absorb what could be anything between 1,500 and 2,000 new patients.

The surgery practice themselves are committed to supporting the community and are very much against a second doctor's surgery away from the centre of the community as proposed. This would be totally unsustainable and would not conform with national planning policy or meet the needs of the community.

Thank you to everyone that has recognised these issues and have responded in the same way against the draft local plan consultation.

other house in the country! This concerto is actually one of a set of 12 Concerti Grossi, published in 1714, after the composer's death; a remarkable set of pieces considered seminal in pointing the way to the later baroque style of Handel and Bach. Corelli was a wellregarded violinist in Italy and was influential in the development of violin technique and performance. Unlike many other composers




